Improving academic outcomes for international school students

This proposal outlines a strategy for international schools to strengthen academic outcomes for students by using AEAS Testing at the point of application and/or commencement.

Ensuring your academic programs are of the highest quality is critically important. Their design and delivery directly influence results, which, in turn, significantly increase students' chances of being accepted into their preferred university and courses, including in countries such as Australia, Canada, USA, UK, New Zealand.



International schools in countries where English is not the primary language offer students a global education experience and the same opportunities as their peers studying at schools in English medium countries such as USA, UK and Australia. Students select to study at an international school because they believe this will provide a quality education leading to their preferred university overseas, and ultimately a successful career.

For those students with another language as their primary language, being exposed to the English language all day, every day, in both academic and social settings, significantly impacts on the development of their English language skills. Students studying at an international school rely upon their school to provide them with adequate opportunities for English language development. The stronger your students' English language skills are, the better academic results will be achieved by each graduating cohort. Students will be able to access their preferred tertiary institutions and courses, and will be more likely to achieve success beyond school and into their professional careers. Strong student results and pathways will benefit the reputation and good will towards your school.

How does your school assess English language and general abilities of new students?

How does your school measure the adequacy of a student's English language skills to meet the demands of your curriculum and programs?

Does your school assess students at application or on commencement?

Is the test your school is currently using standardised and independent, and delivered with high integrity and security?

By requiring students to sit an AEAS Test as part of your application and enrolment processes, your school will receive a standardised, valid, and easily comparable report, which can be reliably used by admissions and academic staff to understand the level of each student's English language and general ability skills, and the extra support they may require to succeed in the classroom.

Approximately 80% of the Australian schools that enrol international students require applicants to sit an AEAS Test as part of their enrolment process. Many of these schools will also then use an additional AEAS Test to assess students when they commence at the beginning of their academic program. This is because there is often a considerable gap in time between the point of application and subsequent commencement, during which a student's English language skills will likely have improved.

For over 35 years, AEAS has been a leading provider of international school student testing, with our student reports being highly valued, and considered reliable and accurate. Using AEAS Testing at point of application allows admissions and academic staff to confirm that students have sufficient English language and academic skills to meet your school's entry requirements. Your graduating students will be able to progress to top universities around the world, and your program will be seen as high quality and will be in high demand.

Testing on commencement provides schools with an additional measure of a student's English language and general abilities just as they are about to begin their academic program. Commencement testing is particularly important where there is a long lead time between application and commencement, as a student's English language skills may improve or deteriorate from those evidenced at application depending upon their previous schooling and language exposure.

Results from commencement testing are provided directly to your school either as individual student reports, which can be shared with parents and students, or as a spreadsheet of results which is only shared with academic staff at your school. The test result information can then be used to tailor English language programs for students, and also to assess which students might require extra support and how this can be offered.



What is included in an AEAS Test?

The AEAS Test includes

- English language proficiency tests (reading, vocabulary, writing, listening and speaking)
- A non verbal general ability test
- A mathematical reasoning test

AEAS Tests are developed specifically for school age students. Testing can be delivered by highly trained AEAS Test Administrators at your school by mutual agreement.

The AEAS Test Fee

For students sitting an AEAS Test to submit with their school application, the standard AEAS Test Fee is AUD \$520. Parents are responsible for paying the Test Fee, unless the school has arranged group testing.

For school arranged testing, AEAS will negotiate the test fee with schools based upon the number of students in each school based test session, the tests included (English, General Ability, Mathematical Reasoning) and/or the type of reporting required.

AEAS offers two main reporting options

- **1.** a full individual student report, as would be received by most students applying directly to international schools; or
- **2.** a summary spreadsheet with results for all students, allowing for quick and easy comparison of the commencing cohort.

Where a school arranges testing, the school will be responsible for the payment of test fees to AEAS. We suggest a small increase to the enrolment fee charged to parents as a way of covering the test fee.

Using DOACAS Testing to improve the quality of your academic programs

Strengthening the admissions selection process, is a simple way to quickly boost your school's academic performance. AEAS Testing is the most reliable and widely accepted means by which to assess incoming students' English language skills and general ability at application and/or upon commencement.

- **3.** assessing students again at the commencement of senior school to ensure academic staff have a baseline understanding of each student's current English language skills
- **4.** tailoring your English language programs to meet the specific needs of all students. Some students may require more or less intensive or additional English language learning
- 5. offering students an AEAS School Preparation Course or an Official AEAS Test Preparation Course as an extra curricular opportunity to improve their English language, and study and examination skills
- **6.** assessing students at the end of particular year levels to confirm students' English language progress and identify any students that may need additional support

One of the major benefits of testing each cohort of students regularly throughout their schooling is the ability for your school to monitor teacher performance. Many of our partner schools in Australia use regular AEAS benchmark testing as a means by which to readily identify problems with English language curriculum design and delivery, as well as the effectiveness of their English language teachers. This feedback loop strengthens the quality of your program and thereby also student outcomes.

AEAS School Preparation Course

Our Preparation Course offers a more holistic approach to student preparation than conventional courses offered by English language training colleges.

Rather than simply focusing on English language development, students studying an AEAS course also gain study and organisational skills that enable them to take personal responsibility for improving their English language abilities. These are the same skills nurtured in Western style classrooms, and are vital for all students to successfully navigate the academic challenges of a high school program.

The 42 hour curriculum has six modules, framed around language skills, and each module can be taught separately. Students must complete all modules to receive a course completion certificate.

Curricula are available for students entering

- Senior school
- Middle school
- Primary school

The objectives of the course are to

- improve English language skills, and grow confidence to communicate in English regardless of current proficiency
- prepare students for English medium classrooms by introducing them to western teaching and learning styles, and assisting them to develop independent study and organisational skills
- help students make the most of studying an international high school qualification by setting goals and taking a proactive approach to studying
- give students an introduction to the AEAS test format. The course teaches students the English language skills to adequately prepare for a test, without offering a 'test preparation course'.

The *Official* AEAS Test Preparation Course

- can be completed within 30 hours with 5–6 hours required for each module
- includes modules for reading, vocabulary, writing, listening and speaking language preparation
- supports genuine English language development for beginners, elementary, pre-intermediate and intermediate students as indicated on the AEAS assessment scale
- supports students to develop test taking skills and critical thinking abilities when responding to test questions
- includes all teacher and classroom materials required for successful teaching and delivery of the course
- can be delivered by teachers who are either English as a first language or English as an additional language speakers
- is suitable for one on one delivery, as well as group or pair learning.
